
This program may become a new stage for you. You are leading 3+1 Program. Tread your own path, grasp your future, and crown your knowledge through this program.


Two World Heritage Sites located in Hiroshima


What is the Morito Institute of Global Higher Education 3+1 Program?

The Morito Institute of Global Higher Education 3+1 Program is one of the inbound programs for international students from our partner universities and institutions. This program is named after the first president of Hiroshima University, Tatsuo Morito. All students participating in the Morito Institute of Global Higher Education 3+1 Program are assigned to a school as a special auditing student based on their research theme.




①Program for students who have completed the 3rd grade at their home university and enrolling in the 4th grade in Hiroshima University for 9 months

Characteristics and Merits of the 3+1 Program

Learning at a Top National University in Japan

Hiroshima University has been one of the most distinguished research universities in Japan and been selected as one of the institutions designated “The Program for Promoting the Enhancement of Research Universities” and “Top Global University Project(Top type).” Hiroshima University has a state-of-the-art research environment where you will be able to focus on pursuing your research activities.

Specialized Education and Research Tutorial for Diploma Thesis by Academic Advisor

An academic advisor at Hiroshima University provides a tutorial for your diploma thesis based on your ‘Research Proposal’. The academic advisor also recommends courses offered at Hiroshima University based on your research theme and gives some advice on your academic research.

Credit Transfer from Hiroshima University to Your Home University

You can acquire credits at Hiroshima University and transfer the credits as required for graduation to your home university. After the credits are approved for graduation at your home university, you will earn your undergraduate degree. A Certificate of Completion will be issued by Hiroshima University to those who fulfill this program requirement.

Moving on to Master's Degree Program at Hiroshima University while holding of the Status as Foreign Research Student (Non-Degree Course)

After completing this program, you will be able to enroll in a school as a Foreign Research Student for 3 months. If you take a graduate school entrance examination and gain admission during this period, you will become officially a graduate student in Hiroshima University. No application fee, admission fee or research fee will be required while holding the status of Foreign Research Student.

Learning about Peace and Improving Your Language Ability

The Peace Studies Course is specified as a required subject. You can learn about Peace at Hiroshima, which is the first nuclear-bombed city. Hiroshima University also offers language courses in order for you to be a person who is active worldwide in the future.

You can Choose your Major based on your Academic Interests from 12 Schools

School of Integrated Arts and Sciences

Aiming to integrate arts and science and cultivate the ability to think scientifically and view things comprehensively.

School of Letters

Studying various human issues to discover new knowledge.

School of Education

Covering a wide range of educational fields to train educational practitioners and researchers.

School of Law

Providing legal knowledge and fostering the ability to service today's global society.

School of Economics

Learning the mechanisms of human behavior and social changes using “money” as a keyword.

School of Science

Cultivating the ability to think logically in the fields chosen from the entire area of science.

School of Medicine

Receiving education for advanced medical specialists.

School of Dentistry

Studying dental medicine and oral health from a whole-body perspective.

School of Pharmaceutical Sciences

Fostering new drug researchers and pharmacists equipped with research ability.

School of Engineering

Aiming to realize monozukuri (manufacturing) for improving our lives through the combination of nature, humans, and technology.

School of Applied Biological Science

Taking up the challenge toward achieving food safety and health, and food production in harmony with the environment, by making use of biotechnology.
