Born in Hiroshima Pref. in 1953, H.E. Tsuchiya earned his master's at Hokkaido University (GS of Environmental Science) in 1979 and in the same year, joined the former Science and Technology Agency (now: integrated into MEXT), after which he held important positions in MEXT as well as in the Agency for Cultural Affairs. Further, he took office as the Deputy Minister of MEXT (2014) and then served as the Vice Minister of MEXT (2015). He took his current position of Advisor to MEXT in Jun. 2016 before assuming his another current position of Ambassador of Japan to Peru in Jan. 2018.

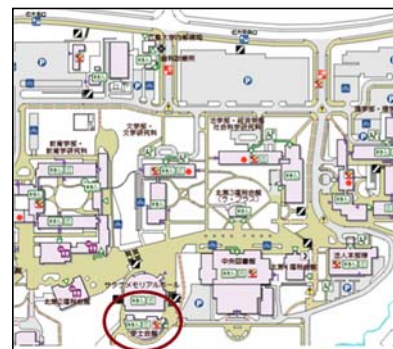
