2. Qualifications

This department aims to develop human resources that can contribute to society by systematically providing academic knowledge to students of different backgrounds.

Applicants must fit one of the following categories:

- (1) Those who have a Master's degree or a degree equivalent to a professional degree in Japan
- (2) Those who have obtained a Master's degree or a degree equivalent to a professional degree in a foreign country
- (3) Those who have taken a correspondence course from an overseas educational institution in Japan and have been awarded a Master's degree or a degree equivalent to a professional degree
- (4) Those who have completed a program at an educational institution in Japan, equivalent to that of a graduate school in a foreign country and accredited by that foreign country and specified by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) of Japan, and who have obtained a degree equivalent to a Master's degree or a professional degree
- (5) Those who have completed the course(s) provided by the United Nations University and received a degree equivalent to a Master's degree
- (6) Those who have completed the curricula of a foreign school, an educational institution specified in (4), or the United Nations University; passed a test and review as specified in Article 16 Section 2 of the Standards for the Establishment of the Graduate Schools; and are deemed to have an academic ability greater than or equal to a Master's degree
- (7) Those designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology of Japan
- (8) Those who are 24 years old or older and recognized in the preliminary screening by the relevant Graduate School as having equal to or higher academic ability than a person who has a Master's or a professional degree
- (9) Those who are expected to obtain one of the above qualifications no later than March 31, 2020

3. Application Procedure

(1) Application Period

3. For the Research Proposal, state the following items concretely:
 - (a) The reason for applying (motivation for considering the concerned Department, etc.)
 - (b) Subject, method, and schedule of the intended research (title, aim, subject, method, expected result, schedule of the research, etc.)
 - (c) Plans after completing the course (how to provide feedback to the results of your research, intended career after completing the concerned major, etc.)

Please use A4 or letter size paper and write on it in Japanese or English with the exception of proper nouns and citations. Your research proposal must not exceed 4 pages (approximately 4,800 characters in Japanese or 1,560 words in English).

Please attach a cover separately from the text, and write your name and the title of your research on it.

You can also submit published articles as a reference (4 copies each).

4. Foreign students with a scholarship offered by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology of Japan who intend to extend its provision period by the end of 2019 fiscal year will be exempted from the application fee. In this case, please submit a document in which the following information is written (must be issued by the school in which you are registered).
 - (a) You are registered as a foreign student with a scholarship offered by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology of Japan.
 - (b) You have the intention to apply for extension of provision of the scholarship.

(4) Precaution

- (a) Incomplete or incorrect application forms and documents will not be accepted. The application may not be accepted when there is missing information.
 - (b) All application forms and documents should reach us together by the deadline.
 - (c) **The certificates to be submitted must be the originals or certified photocopies. Uncertified photocopies will not be recognized as valid certificates. Original copies that are brought in by the applicant during the application period will be returned immediately after confirmation. Applicants who are submitting their documents by mail can also receive the original copies on the day of the examination. If so desired, please indicate this in a separate document (format unspecified; to be submitted along with other application documents).**
 - (d) In case applicants cannot obtain a Certified Academic Record or a Certificate of (Expected) Graduation for whatever reason, they must contact Higashi-Senda Support Office of Hiroshima University before submitting the application documents.
 - (e) If the name of the applicant on certificates differs from the current name, the applicant must attach a certificate explaining such matter.
 - (f) Documents may be neither altered nor amended after submission.
 - (g) **Documents written in languages other than English or Japanese must be translated into English or Japanese.** Submit both the original and translated documents.
 - (h) Accepted application materials (other than original certificates noted in (c)) will not be returned.
 - (i) Personal information (e.g. name, date of birth, gender, etc.) recorded on the application forms will be used in the selection of entrants, notification of passing of entrance examinations, and entrance procedures. Once successful applicants have entered the university, the university will manage the data for use in matters relating to student support (e.g. scholarship applications, tuition fee exemption applications, etc.). The data will not be used for any other purpose or be seen by anyone except the staff of this university. However, there may be cases whereby relevant procedures are entrusted to external companies with a proper agreement regarding the appropriate use of personal information.
 - (j) When the department notices misrepresentation or false pretenses in the application document, rescission of examination results will be made even after admission.

6. Applicant Assessment

(1) Entrance Examination

The selection of successful applicants is based on the comprehensive results of review of Master thesis, research plan, and an entrance examination (oral examinations).

Oral Examination	It is intended to measure the motivation to learn and awareness of the issues related to the research theme.
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※If you submit your GRE Score Report, an interview via Skype or other means can be substituted for the oral examination by mutual arrangement at the time of application.

(2) Standards of Grading and Admission Assessing

A Master thesis, oral examinations, and a research plan are each graded A–D. Only applicants with a grade of A or B on all three categories will be admitted. Applicants with a grade of D in at least one of the categories will not be admitted. If at least one of the three categories is graded C, the admission will be discussed individually.

7. Announcement of Admission Result

Announcement will be made at 2:00 p.m. on Friday, February 21, 2020. The applicants who pass the entrance examination will be announced at Higashi-senda Campus and notified by postal mail of their acceptance. The results will also be announced on the department website. Because we can only use characters from JIS level-1 to level-4, the name of applicants in the passing notification may be different from the original characters written in the application forms. Please acknowledge the usage of Katakana characters when there are technical

constraints. We cannot respond to inquiries on results of the entrance examination by telephone or any other methods.

8. Fees

Admission fee: JPY 282,000

Tuition Fee: JPY 535,800 (for one year)

9. Extended Study Program

 - ③ A return envelope (standard size, 120 mm × 235 mm) with the applicant’s name and address, as well as stamp (JPY 404). Please note that applicant may be asked for corrections if any of these are incomplete.
- (3) The department sends the “Notice of Determination for Disclosure of Personal Information of the Entrance Examination of Hiroshima University” to the applicant by registered mail using the return envelope provided by the applicant within 30 days of the application.

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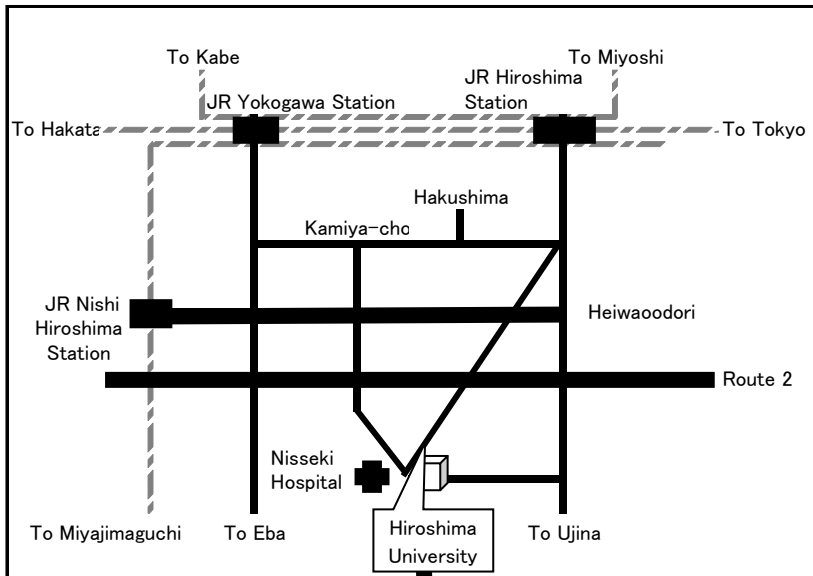

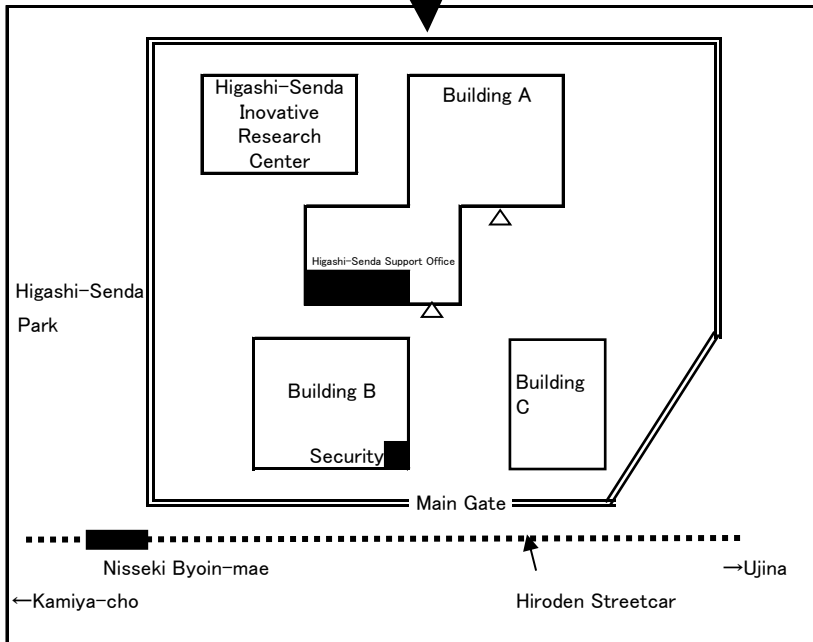


Accessing to the Higashi-Senda Campus

Take the an airport limousine bus to JR Hiroshima Bus Center

- From JR Hiroshima Station
Take a streetcar(Hiroden) on the Hiroshima Electric Raillyway bound for(1)Hiroshima Port at theHiroshima Station (M1),and get off at the Nisseki Byoin-mae Station(U6)(approx.30 minutes).From Hiroshima Station,it is a 3-minutes walk to the campus

- From the Hiroshima Bus Center
Take a streetcar(Hiroden) on the Hiroshima Electric Railway bound for (3) Hiroshima Port or for(7) Hiroden-honsha-mae at the Kamiya-cho-mae station (M9), and get off at the Nisseki Byoin-mae Station (U6)(approx.10 minutes). From there, it is a 3-minute walk to the campus
