Seiko Mimaki is an associate professor at Takasaki City University of Economics. She received her BA, MA, and Ph.D. from the University of Tokyo, and was a visiting fellow at Harvard University and Johns Hopkins University. Mimaki explores various transnational reconciliation and peace-building efforts in human history. Her book, *Senso Iyoku no Jidai: Kikino Nijyunen no America no Kokuhaikankei Shiso*, (*The Era of the Outlawry of War Movement: The American philosophy of international Relations in the Twenty Year's Crisis*) (Nagoya University Press, 2014), received a Hiroshi Shimizu Award from the Japanese Association for American Studies in 2015. Since March 2019, she has been Op-ed board member at Asahi Shimbun Newspaper.
