#### 1. Completion requirements

- ・Acquisition of at least 30 credits as specified in Section 2 below
- ・Receipt of research guidance
- ・Passing the master's thesis evaluation and final examination or Qualifying Examination 1 (QE1 only applies for TAOYAKA students)

#### 2. Required credits for each course category

- (1) Common Graduate Course: 1 credit or more from Sustainable Development Course, 1 credit or more from Career Development and Data Literacy Course
- (2) Common Graduate School Course: 4 credits or more (Special Lecture of Humanities and Social Sciences [2 credits] is required.)
- (3) Common Division Course: 2 credits or more
- (4) Program Specialization Course: 12 credits or more from International Peace and Co-existence Program Specialization Courses (Peace and Co-existence A [1 credit] is required) and 4 credits of Special Study
- (5) Specialization Course from Other Program: 2 credits or more  
If a student has taken a specialization course at another graduate school with the permission of his/her supervisor and earned credits, these credits can be included in the required credits for the Specialization Course from Other Program.
- (6) International Peace and Co-existence Program Specialization Course, or Specialization Course from Other Program: 4 credits or more
