

## **Diploma Policy**

### **International Economic Development Program**

#### **(Master's Course)**

The International Economic Development Program will award one of the following degrees to a student who has acquired the capabilities described below, earned the required credits, and passed the master's thesis examination and final examination, or passed the qualifying examination for research in the doctoral course, according to the research theme and the specialized area: Master of International Cooperation Studies, Master of Economics, Master of Business Administration, and Master of Philosophy.

- (1) Advanced knowledge and an analytical capacity in order to overlook long-term global economic development and to discuss the importance of economic development to various problems of developing countries and in solving these problems.
- (2) Advanced analytical capacity and determination capability in order to engage in discussion and to make decisions based on evidence and data.
- (3) Wide and profound education as well as a broad point of view that is not limited to within a narrow, specialized area.
- (4) The ability to apply sophisticated logical thinking even when encountering unfamiliar situations or concepts, and the ability to identify problems backed by multiple points of view.
- (5) The ability to engage in communication and to make a presentation as a practitioner with a global mind, and the ability to get things done in order to exhibit the leadership required for practice.
- (6) Awareness of one's mission as a master's degree holder and high ethical standards.

#### **(Doctoral Course)**

The International Economic Development Program will award one of the following degrees to a student who has acquired the capabilities described below, earned the required credits, and passed the doctor's thesis examination and final examination, according to the research theme and the specialized area: Doctor of International Cooperation Studies, Doctor of Economics, Doctor of Business Administration, and Doctor of Philosophy.

- (1) Distinguished knowledge and an analytical capacity in order to overlook long-term global economic development and to discuss the importance of economic development to various problems of developing countries and in solving these problems.
- (2) Distinguished analytical capacity and determination capability in order to engage in discussion and to make decisions based on evidence and data.
- (3) Wide and profound education as well as an interdisciplinary and international point of view that is not limited to within a narrow, specialized area.
- (4) The ability to apply sophisticated logical thinking even when encountering unfamiliar situations

or concepts, and the outstanding ability to identify problems backed by flexible and multiple points of view.

- (5) The ability to engage in communication and to make a presentation as a practitioner with a global mind, and the ability to get things done in order to exhibit the leadership required for practice.
- (6) Awareness of one's mission as a doctor's degree holder and extremely high ethical standards.
