Garba Diallo

Founder of Crossing Borders

Mr. Garba Diallo is the founding Director of Crossing Borders and head of Crossing Borders Global Studies, at Nordfyns Højskole in Denmark.

Garba Diallo has been developing and carrying out current global issues through education projects for global citizenship for 30 years.

After 7 years of international development studies at the University of Oslo and work as a freelance journalist and lecturer in Norway, Garba moved to Denmark in 1992.

The first 15 years in Denmark, Garba worked as Director of International Programs for and acting Principal for 2 years at the International People's in Elsinore, Denmark. Then the past 12 years, he has developed and taught Crossing Borders Global Studies at Krogerup People's College in Denmark. Now he is the head teacher of Crossing Borders Global Studies at Nordfyns Højskole

Mari Katayanagi

Professor of Hiroshima University

Prof. Katayanagi teaches at both International Peace and Coexistence Programme (IPC Programme), Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences; and Department of Integrated Global Studies, School of Integrated Arts and Sciences, Hiroshima University. She is the Director of the IPC Programme and also Vice Director of the Centre for Peace, Hiroshima University.

She spent about ten years in the Balkans as a practitioner in the peace field. She served a UN peacekeeping operation in the 1990s, and the Office of the High Representative in Bosnia and Herzegovina as a political advisor from 2004 to 2009. Her earlier positions also include senior research fellow at the JICA Research Institute, Tokyo; and First Secretary of the Embassy of Japan in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

She received an LLM in international human rights law from Essex University and a PhD in law from Warwick University. Her research interests are peacebuilding, conflict transformation and international law, particularly international human rights law.
