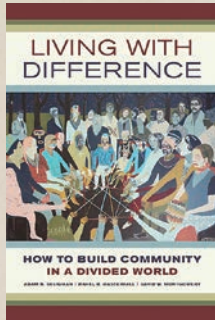

Adam Seligman is a sociologist and Professor of Religion, Boston Univ., who has lived and taught at universities in Israel, Hungary, and the US. His research topics include the study of civil society, trust, authority, tolerance and ritual. His works have been translated into more than ten languages, and among his most recent works are *Living with Difference: How to Build Community in a Divided World* (2015) and "The Tragedy of Human Rights: Liberalism and the Loss of Belonging" (*Society* 56, 2019) (<https://www.resetdoc.org/story/tragedy-human-rights-liberalism-loss-belonging/>) As a director of CEDAR he leads workshops every year for multicultural education in different parts of the world including Israel, the US, Turkey, the UK, Bulgaria, Indonesia, and Uganda. Recipient of 2020 Dr. Leopold Lucas Prize.
