APPLICATION INFORMATION

Nominations by Home Institution

From 2022/23 Academic Year onwards, we will send the nomination link only to the partner university that has returned the completed pre-nomination form that we sent. Please make sure that the nomination information is correct, especially the students' email addresses and the program that the students wish to enroll in since the nomination form cannot be changed or edited. When any change is made to the information about any student in the nomination form, the information about that student has to be deleted and the home institution has to re-nominate the student.

Please note that in each semester, we will create a new nomination link. The nomination link from the previous semester will be inactivated.



Applications by Nominated Students

After the coordinator has submitted the nomination of the exchange students, the students will automatically receive the instructions from the OIA via email. They are required to fill in and upload the supporting documents in the application form before the deadline. Without the required documents, the students' application will not be accepted.



Admission Requirements

GPA requirement:

preferable 2.75 on a 4.0 scale

Language Requirements for Non-native English Speakers

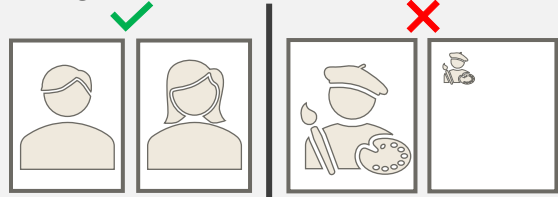
TOEFL: iBT: 79
CBT: 213
PBT: 550

IELTS: Minimum 6.0 (Depends)

NOTES:

1. The test must be taken not more than 2 years before applying.
2. The BA in Language and Culture (BALAC) program at the Faculty of Arts requires an overall band 7.0 of IELTS or equivalent and does not accept TOEFL ITP.
3. For those exchange students who wish to attend the Thai Language programs offered by the Department of Thai in the Faculty of Arts, they are required to submit the result of the Thai language test that they have taken, and they must be fluent in all the four language skills — listening, speaking, reading and writing.
4. Please note that each program/Faculty has its own requirements which all students have to abide to, and they have to carefully go through these requirements. Some programs strictly require a language certificate but for some programs, language requirements are flexible. Thus, the OIA recommends that all students have minimum IELTS or TOEFL scores as required above.

Supporting Documents

1. A student's passport photo on white background

2. Two reference letters from academic advisors
3. An official academic transcript (to be issued by the institution the students are attending)
4. An English proficiency score record (for non-native speakers of English)
5. A copy of the first page of the passport (The passport must be valid for at least 6 months before its expiry date, and it is advisable that the validity of the passport should cover the students' whole exchange period at Chulalongkorn University.)
6. A Statement of Purpose (SOP) of 500-800 words
7. A list of the courses offered by Chulalongkorn University that the students wish to attend (Wishlist)
8. The consent form of a COVID-19 infection prevention plan* and
9. A medical certificate, an official health report or a proof of COVID-19 vaccinations.*

* This depends on the COVID-19 situation during the actual exchange period and the decision of the COVID-19 Emergency Operation Center Committee of the University will be taken as the final verdict.

Proposed Grading System:

Standard grading system with A, B, C, D and F

Grading with "S" for Satisfactory or "U" for Unsatisfactory (with examination)

Grading with "V" for Visitor or "W" for Withdrawn (without examination)

Maximum Course Load Per Semester

Undergraduate student: 22 credits (approx. 7-8 courses)

Graduate student: 15 credits (approx. 5 courses)

NOTES:

At Chula, in lectures, seminars, discussions or other forms of instruction, 1 academic credit is equivalent to 1 hour of work per week or approximately 15 hours in a semester.

STUDENT VISA APPLICATION

All students must apply for a student/education visa (Non-Immigrant Visa – ED) in order to come to study in Thailand. The OIA will provide them with a cover letter, a Certificate of Admission and supporting documents for visa application, all of which will be sent to the International Office at the students' home institutions.

In the application form, the applicants are required to fill in the address of the Royal Thai Embassy/Consulate in their current country of residence. If there is more than one address of the Royal Thai Embassy/Consulate in the students' resident countries, it is important that they choose which Royal Thai Embassy/Consulate they wish to submit their visa application. This is because the Royal Thai Embassy/Consulate address chosen by the students will appear in a cover letter, which is required by many Royal Thai Embassies/Consulates.
