This is to make it easier to see the GP when you need to, as GPs are often unable to give appointments to people not registered at their Surgery, except in a real emergency.
	To register at the Doctor's Surgery or Health Centre, you will need: your passport; evidence that you are a student (for example, your enrolment letter or student card); and proof of your UK address (for example, accommodation contract or tenancy agreement).
