## Hiroshima University's activity restrictions index for preventing the spread of novel coronavirus [Revised February 27, 2023]

## Effective March 13, 2023, wearing masks will be optional. However, if you experience symptoms such as coughing or sneezing, please wear a non-woven mask.

The 6-level index serves to HU members (students, faculty and administrative members) as rough guidelines so that they allow the members to act in an appropriate and flexible manner according to the situation. We kindly ask all HU members to take appropriate actions based on these guidelines. Also, please stay away from the crowds, wash your hands often, wear non-woven cloth masks, and follow cough etiquette. The following restriction index applies to all HU campuses, except medical activities at HU's Hospital.

(※2) Those who take classes on campus due to unavoidable reasons, those who engage in essential research activities and lab assets maintenance (maintenance of cells/organisms, replenishing liquid nitrogen, etc.), and those looking after living organisms must obtain permissions from the respective graduate school's dean or research center director in advance.
