- Inserted in the Student Handbook
- ◎ **No. of credits required for graduation: 1 2 8** credits  
 (Liberal arts education **4 2** + Specialized education **8 6**)

## ◎ What is a credit?

= a point given to students when they are judged to have passed a course based on their exam and report/ essay results, their participation, and attitude in classes after attending the classes throughout one semester or term

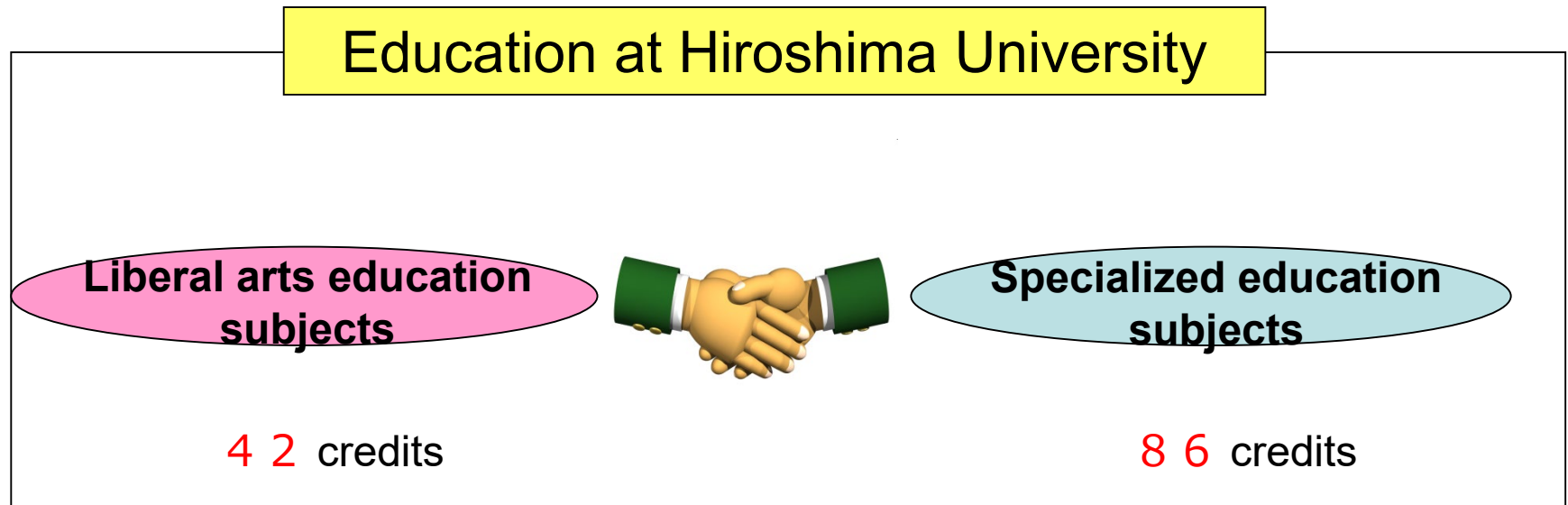

# Liberal Arts Education and Specialized Education (1)

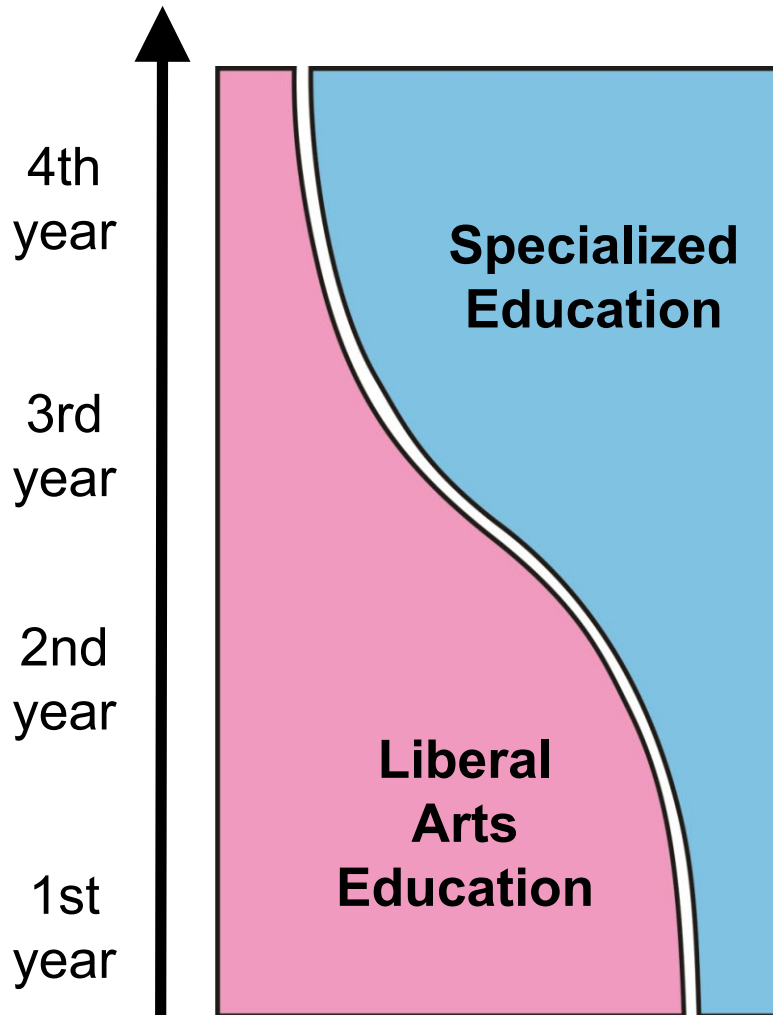
- ◎ No. of credits required for graduation: 1 2 8 credits

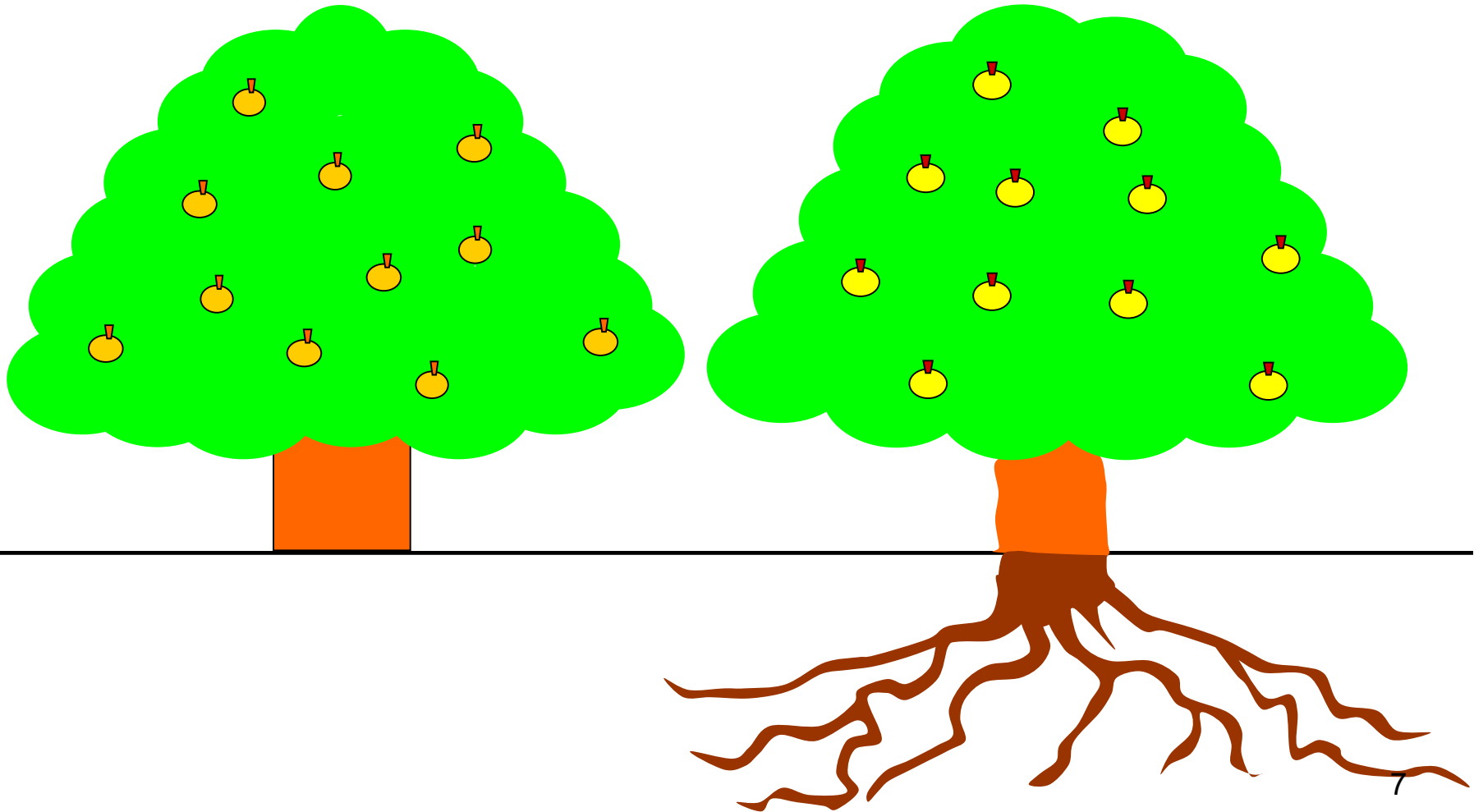
Students mainly study liberal arts education in their first year at the university.

## Aim of liberal arts education

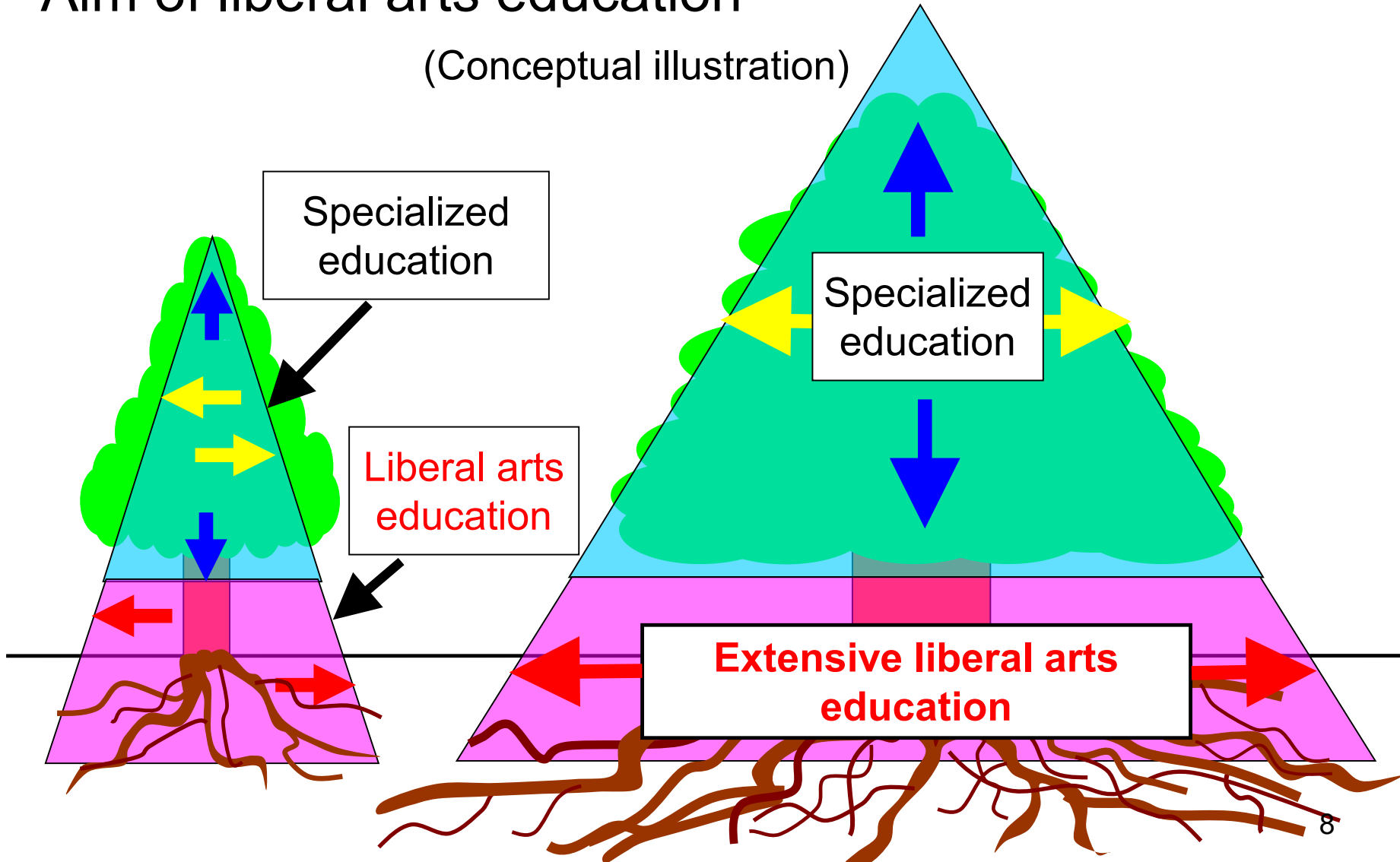

# Course Types in Liberal Arts Education (1)

## Peace Science Courses

- **Required subject** (= a subject that students must take) : **2 credits**
- Think about peace from diverse perspectives based on the spirit of the pursuit of peace, one of Hiroshima University's five guiding principles.
- Students are required to submit **a report on peace**.  
= The credits are not given unless the report is submitted.

Be sure to confirm the details posted on "MOMIJI."

\* Start preparing for the report as early as possible



# Course Types in Liberal Arts Education (2)

## Basic Courses in University Education

### ◎ Introduction to University Education

Important information will be provided at the end of this guidance.

- **Required subject:** 2 credits
- Consider what learning at university means to clarify your goals at the university and acquire the basic skills and attitudes necessary to study at university.
- A lecture series is offered by renowned figures under the title of “Becoming a Global Citizen: Lecture by Special Instructor.”

### ◎ Introductory Seminar for First-Year Students

- **Required subject:** 2 credits
- Learn how to study at university through small-group classes and voluntary learning

### ◎ Advanced Seminar

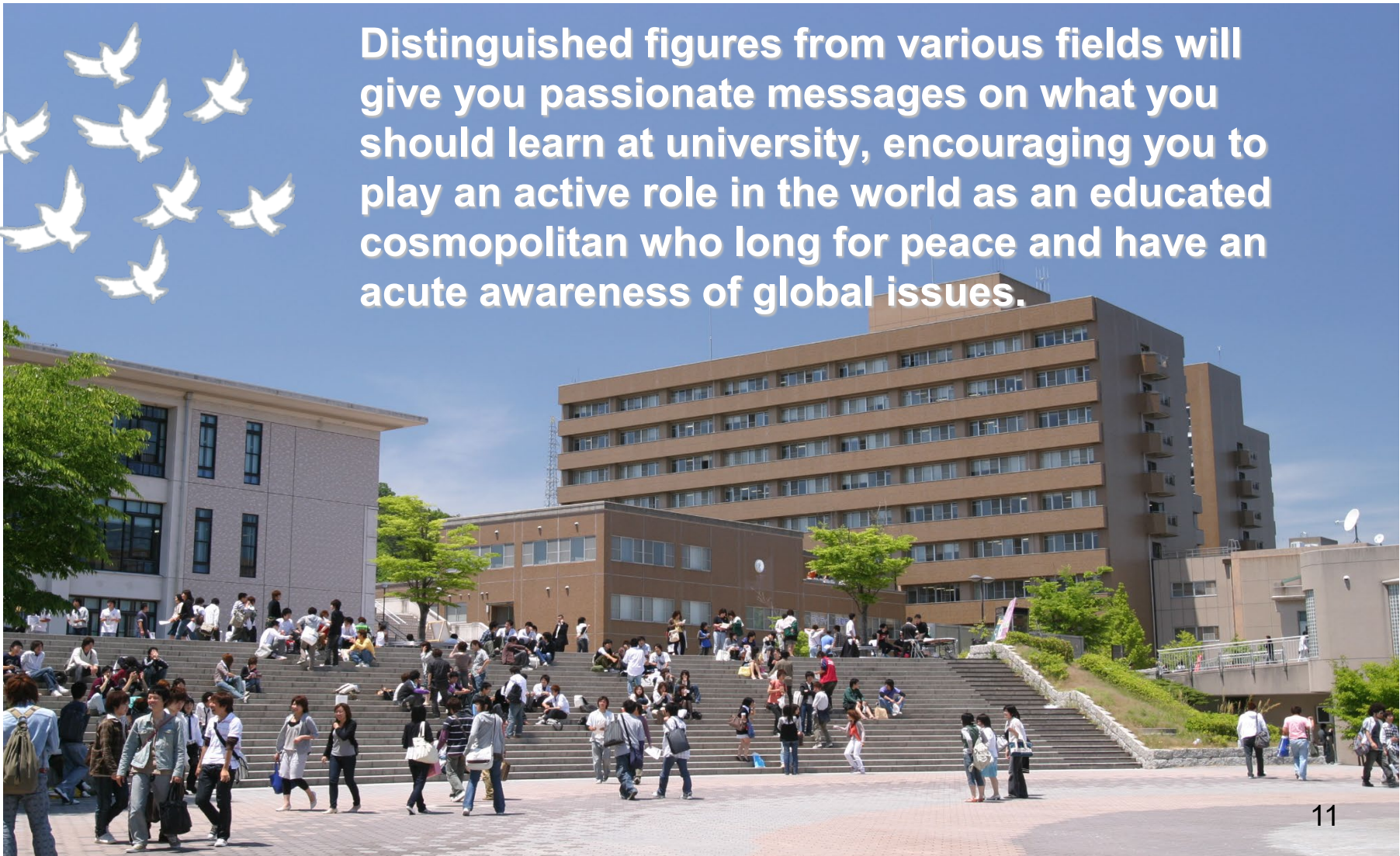
- Develop skills to find and solve problems through discussions and hands-on learning in mixed-school and mixed-grade small class.

# Course Types of Liberal Arts Education (5)

## Common Subjects

### ◎ Foreign Languages

【Type 1: Students who are native Japanese speakers】

English courses 4 credits + Non-English Foreign Languages courses 4 credits

【Type 2: Students who are not native Japanese speakers 】

Japanese courses 8 credits

【Type 3: Students who are admitted to be fluent in both English and Japanese 】

Non-English Foreign Languages courses 8 credits

- Develop communication skills to receive and transmit information in different foreign languages in order to respond to the age of globalization.





# Course Types of Liberal Arts Education (6)

## ◎ Information and Data Science Courses

- **Required subject: 2 credits, Elective Required subject: 2 credits** •

Acquire basic knowledge and skills necessary to use data more effectively in an advanced information society.

## ◎ Health and Sports Courses

**Elective Required subject: 2 credits**

- Understand scientific theories to promote health and physical strength, and develop the attitude and cooperative manners necessary to enjoy sports throughout lifetime.

## ◎ Social Cooperation Courses

- Understand diversity in society and develop the ability to live and play an active role in society by engaging in various practical activities.

## ◎ Foundation Courses

- Acquire the basic knowledge and skills essential in specialized studies.

# Basic Knowledge on How to Create a Class Timetable (1)

## What to prepare

- Liberal Arts Education Class Timetable
- Student Handbook ... Graduation Requirements  
(Course Registration List)

## Types of course registration

- **Required** → Students must take the course.
- **Elective required** → Students must earn the prescribed number of credits from a list of courses designated by each school.
- **Elective** → Course requirements for graduation vary depending on the School or Department.

# Basic Knowledge on How to Create a Class Timetable (2)

## Required and Required Elective Subjects

- As for some required subjects and required elective subjects, you are required to take relevant subjects at the specific class periods on the specific day of the week that have been designated in advance. Follow the instructions given by your school or department.

## Syllabus

- Information on individual courses (aims/content) and grading criteria are provided.
- Available on “My MOMIJI”

## Language of instruction

- Language used in classes is included in syllabi.  
(J: Japanese, E: English, B: Japanese and English, O: Other Languages)
- \* Subjects offered in “J” and “B” may be difficult to complete for students without sufficient Japanese proficiency. For the details, be sure to confirm with the instructors in charge of those subjects beforehand.

# Basic Knowledge on How to Create a Class Timetable (3)

Course name is shown differently depending on the instruction language in Liberal Arts Education.

- Language of Instruction (J:Japanese, B:Japanese and English or O:Other)

→ The course name is shown in Japanese, or in both Japanese and English.

ex.) 「大学教育入門」、「大学教育入門(Introduction to University Education)」 etc.

- Language of Instruction (E:English)

→ The course name is shown in English.

ex.) 「Introduction to University Education」 etc.



# Important Notes for Course Registration (1)

- Confirm courses that you need to take on with the Graduation Requirements (Course Registration List). → Be clear on your registration priority.
- Check terms and conditions for course registration.

# Important Notes for Course Registration (2)

⑥ Peace Science Courses	Class Timetable provided by IGS	Take the course offered in English. (Confirm the details on the Syllabus.)
⑦ Information and Data Science Courses	Class Timetable provided by IGS	On MY MOMIJI, you can check the course that you should take and that, in advance, you have been registered in. As for the 2 <sup>nd</sup> course, you need to select and register by yourself.
⑧ Area Courses/Foundation Courses <u>designated as elective courses</u>	Class Timetable provided by IGS	14 credits chosen freely from Area and Foundation Courses. You can also include a credit of Advanced Seminar.



# Important Notes for Course Registration (3)

Course	Required materials	Points to note
⑩ Health and Sports Courses	Syllabus	Lecture-based subjects (Health and Sports Sciences), practical training-based subjects (Practicum in Sports), and subjects that combined lecture and practical training (Sports Theory and Exercise) are offered. (Confirm the first meeting place on Liberal Arts Education page of My MOMIJI.)
⑪ Social Cooperation Courses	Syllabus	Confirm the Course Registration List of your School and take courses according to your needs and interests.
⑫ Specialized Subjects	Syllabus	If there are specialized subjects <u>designated on the Course Registration List</u> , confirm the day of the week and class period in which they are offered, and register for them.

# Upper Limit of the Number of Credits for Registered Courses

- ◎ The maximum number of credits that can be registered for in a semester is pre-determined.

( 2 6 credits per semester)

- ◎ Academic performance evaluation

[S: Excellent]	90 points or more	} Pass (credits awarded)
[A: Superior]	80–89 points	
[B: Good]	70–79 points	
[C: Fair]	60–69 points	
[D: Poor]	Less than 60 points	→ Failure (No credit awarded)

→ Impacts the calculation of **GPA** (Grade Point Average).

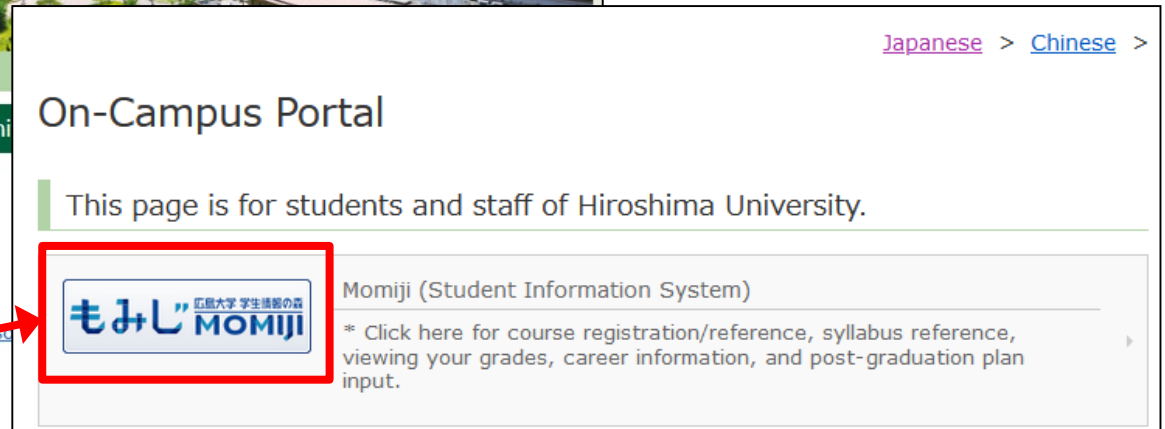
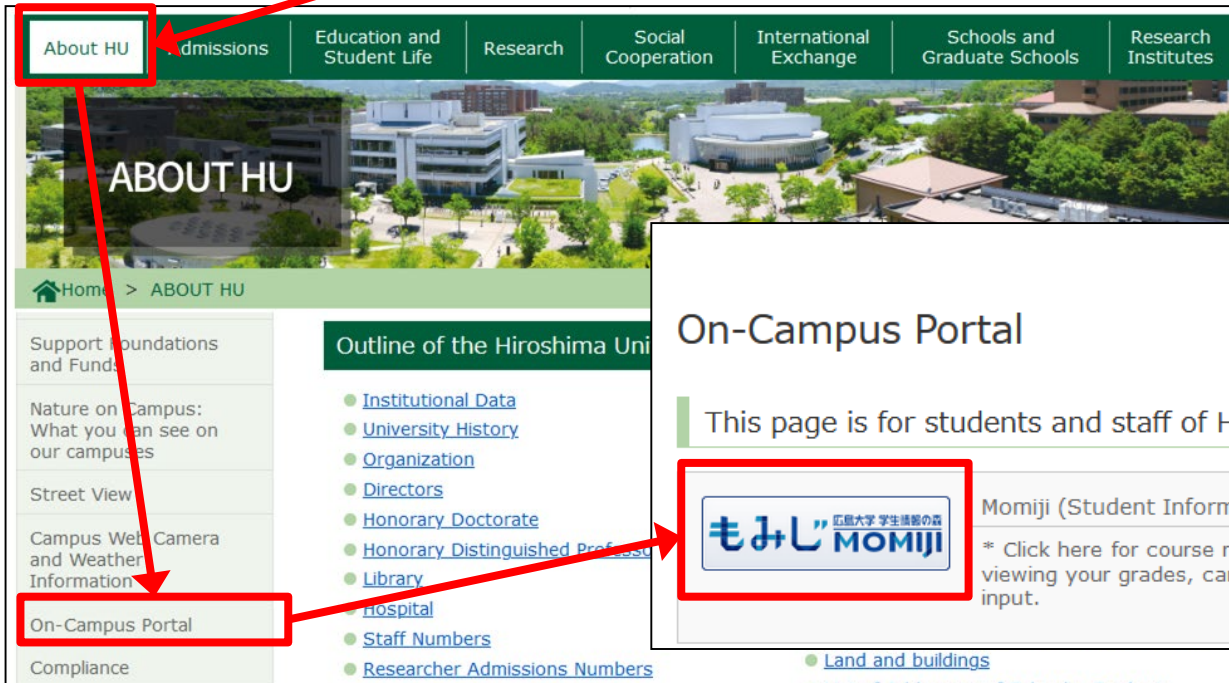

### ◎ Course registration period

Once your registration has been finalized, you cannot make any new registration and cannot delete or change your finalized registration.

Register for courses (including intensive ones) that you wish to take in the 1st and 2nd terms.

### ◎ Adjustment Period

You are not allowed to register for/ withdraw from courses in which a random selection occurred.

If the number of registered students for a course exceeds its upper limit, the number will be reduced by a computerized random selection (If you are removed from your desired courses as a result of the selection, your registration for the courses will be deleted).

### ◎ Confirmation and Revision Period

During this period, check your course registration and class schedule.

You can add other courses or delete your registration (except for courses where the random selection occurred).

2<sup>nd</sup>-term courses can also be registered/deleted between June 5 (Wed) and June 12 (Wed) (\* This period might be changed later).

# If you missed a class

## Absence Report (Report of Non-Attendance)

- You can submit an absence report in case you are absent from classes for two weeks or more.
- This form should be submitted to the Student Support Office of your School.
- A document that certifies the reason for your absence (a medical certificate, etc.) should also be submitted.
- \* Your instructor will be notified of the reason for your absence described on your report. Please note that, however, special consideration for the absence will not necessarily be given by the instructor.
- \* If you are absent from classes for less than two weeks, you need to notify your instructor(s) of the reason for your absence by yourself.

# Term-end Examination

## Cheating is not Tolerated

- If you cheat on an exam, “F” grades (Failure) will be given to all Liberal Arts Education courses that you take in the semester when you committed the academic misconduct (Except for Introductory Seminar for First-Year Students).
- You are not allowed to bring class materials to your exam unless instructed otherwise by your teacher

1st term: May 30 (Thu.) – June 5 (Wed.)

2nd term: July 26 (Fri.) – August 1 (Thu.)

## ◎ Application for Makeup Examination

- You are eligible to take a make-up exam if you cannot take your term-end exam due to illness or any other unavoidable reasons.
- An application should be submitted to the Student Support Office in your School within one week after the missed exam.
- A document certifying the reason for your absence on the exam date (a medical certificate, etc.) should also be submitted.

# Credit Approval

- ◎ Credits are awarded if you obtain a specific score or grade in a foreign language proficiency test.
- ◎ Credits earned at universities outside Japan can be recognized.
- ◎ Credits can be transferred from subjects taken at the Open University of Japan. (Handling of credits varies depending on the School.)
- ◎ Credits that have already been earned can be recognized (if you have earned credits at other universities).

For details, ask the Student Support Office of your School.

# TOEIC® L&R IP Test

The test is conducted on a university-wide basis.

Every student has two chances to take the test.

① The 1st school year: Online test

② The third school year and thereafter (The date of the test varies depending on the School.)

- Your English skills are measured at the time of enrollment and graduation.
- Under designated terms by HU, your TOEIC scores can be used for credit approval.

\* Although you are required to take the test offered by the university twice during your time at the university, you may be able to take the test more than twice if you desire to do so. Since you can also apply for public TOEIC® L&R tests through Co-op, you are advised to actively take these tests.



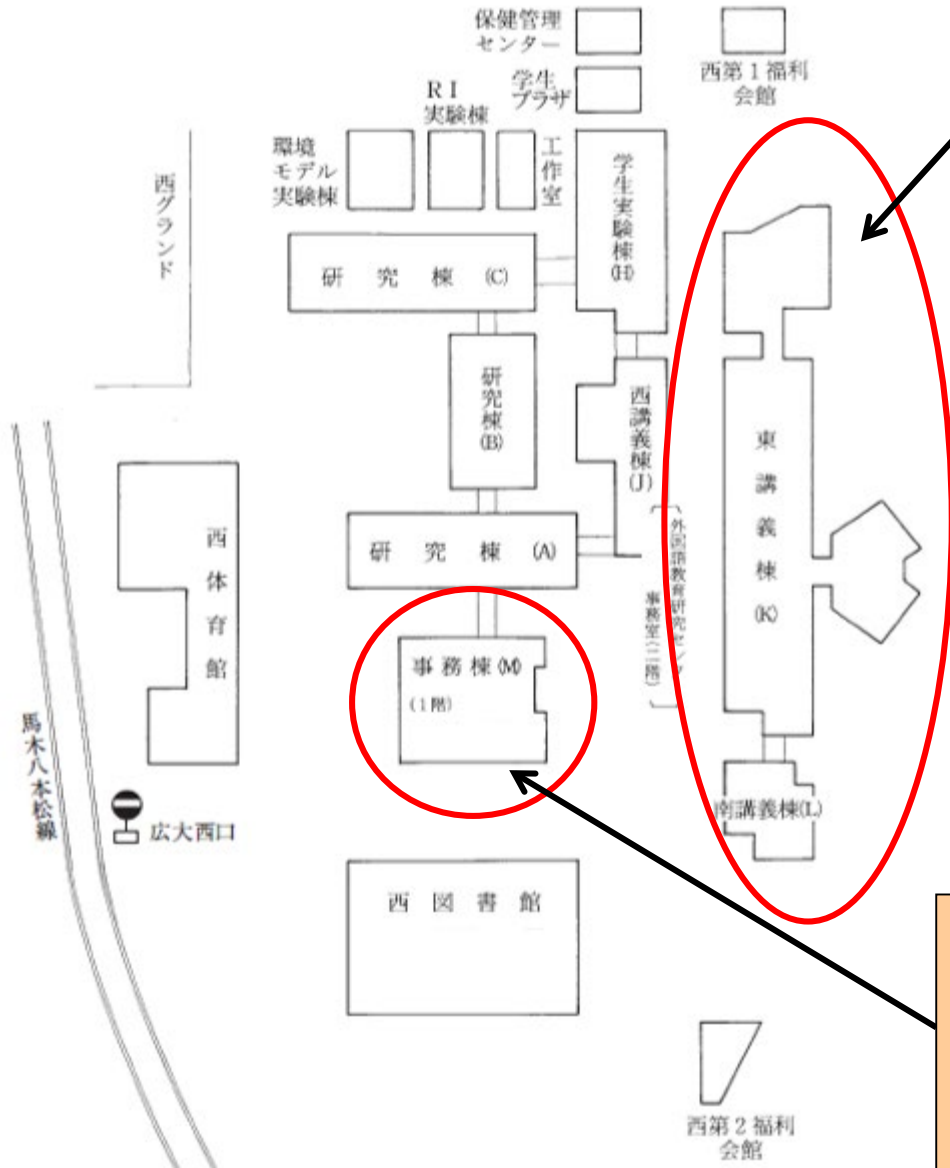
