Q & A

Q I'm a new student, and I am uncertain what goals to set or how to proceed from here.

A The student staff at the Center for Academic Practice and Resources are Hiroshima University graduate students. Talking with the student staff about their experiences can give you some insights. Come in for a consultation. They can also direct you to other consultation services appropriate for your issue.

Q I need help in completing a class assignment.

A The Center for Academic Practice and Resources accepts consultations for mathematics, physics, chemistry, and English. The student staff in each field can give easy-to-understand advice from a student's perspective.

Q I don't know how to write a report or thesis paper.

A The student staff can give advice on writing reports and thesis papers by explaining their study methods and pointing you to helpful materials. They can also direct you to support centers for report and thesis paper writing at the university.

Q I need advice on registering for classes or about credits for graduation.

A The student staff will go through the student handbook or the "Momiji" system together with you. They will also direct you to where you can get more specific advice.

Q I need specific advice on how to study.

A The student staff in each field can explain their study methods and point you to helpful books and other.



At the Center for Academic Practice and Resources, the student staff will listen attentively to whatever you need to discuss and use their knowledge and experience to offer advice that will guide you to the right solution. If your issue is too difficult to be solved with the student staff alone, they can also point you to other appropriate consultation services offered by the university.

What is the Center for Academic Practice and Resources?

At the Center for Academic Practice and Resources, students can use the Learning Support Counter to receive counseling on concerns about day-to-day studies and study methods for various areas of liberal arts education (mathematics, physics, chemistry, and English) from the student staff (principally graduate students). The Center also holds events such as Freshmen Get-together and HU Students' Meeting, an event that is planned by the student staff for new students and HU students.

Freshmen Get-together HU Students' Meeting

This is a forum for communication beyond the boundaries of academic department, graduate school, nationality, or age, held for new students and transfer students around four times a year. The participants are divided into small groups that include student staff to create a perfect opportunity for discussing their concerns about studies and student life, deepening connections through games, and expanding their social circles. Notice of these events will be provided via "Momiji" and school bulletin boards, so feel free to participate.

TA Seminar

Hiroshima University has a three-level TA system (Hirodai TA) that provides support for assistants and learning in classes and elsewhere. - ◆ Face-to-face consultation
Face to face consultations are available at any time during the above hours. It is not necessary to make an advance reservation. Please come directly to the first floor of the Student Plaza.
- ◆ Consultation by email
Consultations by email are also available. First enter the details of your consultation in the "Application Form for Consultation" available on the homepage of this Center. After your request is received, the student staff will respond by email concerning the entered consultation details.

- ◆ Online consultations
