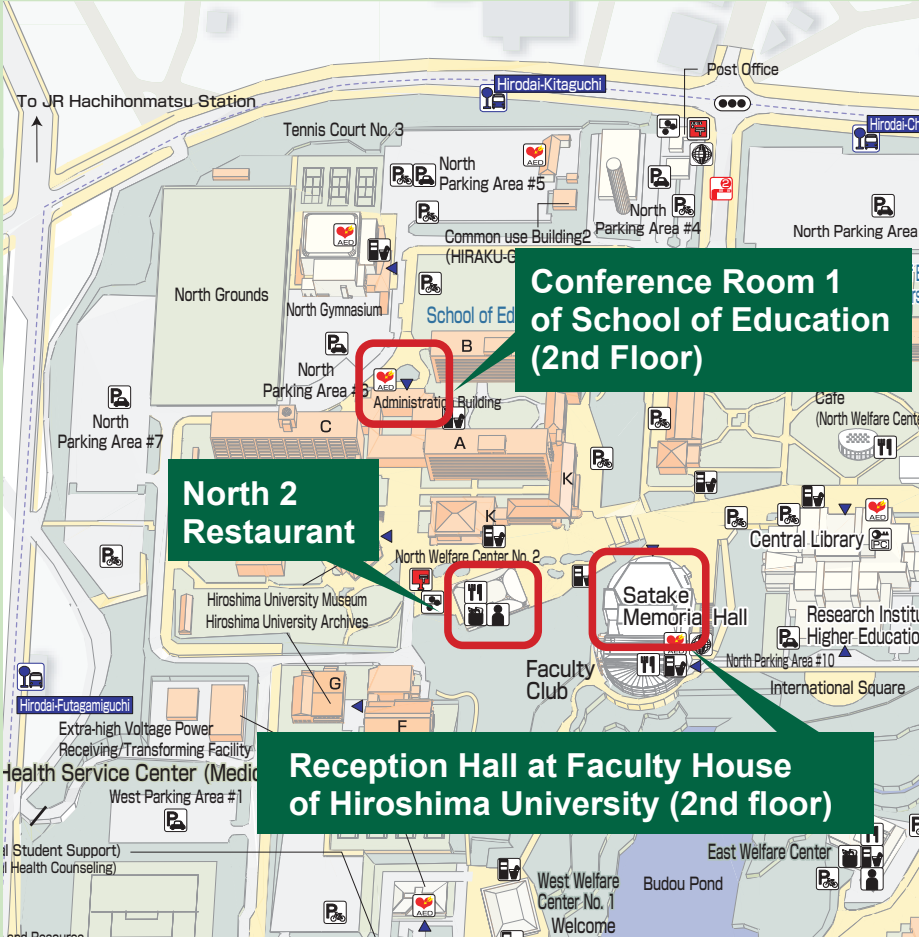

Greetings

Dear INEI Friends,

Welcome to Hiroshima! Hiroshima University (HU) is the eleventh and newest member of the Network. This is the first time for HU to host INEI annual conference.

HU became a member of INEI in 2018. Initially, it was decided that HU would host an INEI annual conference in 2022. COVID-19, however, forced us to postpone it to 2024, when HU is celebrating its 150th anniversary. Meanwhile, wars have occurred, climate changes have proceeded, and AI technologies have altered ways of learning and communication. We have faced difficulties that require further global collaborations.

The theme for the INEI 2024 Annual Conference in Hiroshima is **Teacher Education for Peace, Local Knowledge, and Future Generations**. Another extended version of it is “Our Missions: Teacher Education for Peace and Social Justice, Local and Indigenous Knowledge, and Future Generations.” HU was re-established after the destruction of the first atomic bomb at the end of World War II. Since then, the mission of the new HU is to contribute to humankind’s well-being by realizing a free and peaceful society. I wanted to share the importance of peace education with INEI friends here in Hiroshima. Also, I believe that a common task of INEI members is to build a better world by connecting people, regions, and generations through teacher education and educational research. In achieving the task, we will start to connect ourselves: to facilitate active exchanges among INEI members to know each other. The conference will develop cross-cultural and intergenerational linkages university-wide and community-wide through interactive experiences in peace education and cultural exchange with HU students, and even with students from neighboring schools and local people. I hope that the three-day conference in Hiroshima will promote our mutual understanding and strengthen our bonds for further collaboration.

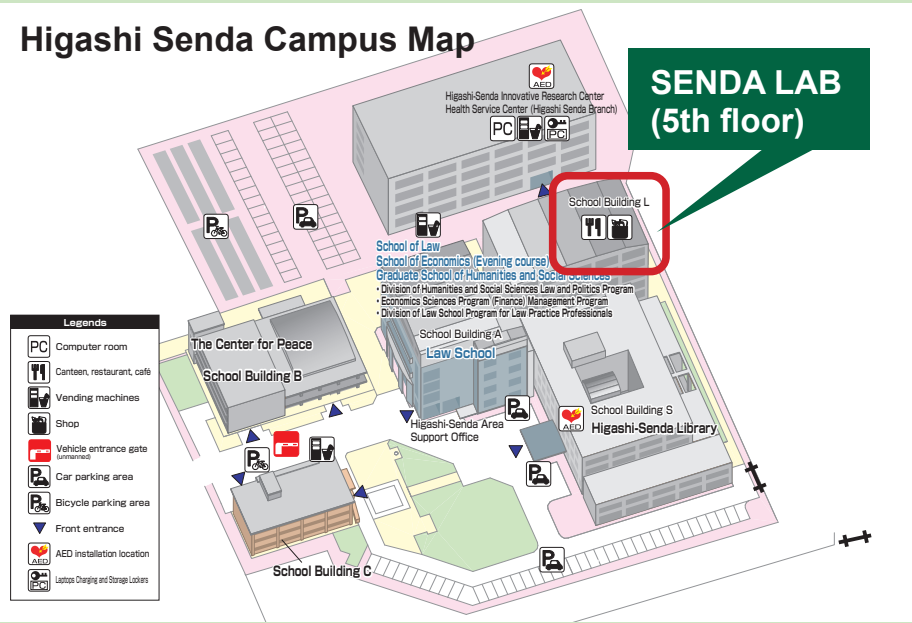
Jongsung Kim
