Dr. Hoi Shan Cheung is a leading researcher in the field of attachment studies in Asia. Her research has focused on the core tenets of attachment theory in an Asian context, by examining how maternal sensitivity and children's attachment representations are linked to myriad child development outcomes.

Dr. Cheung's recent work investigates the forms and functions of parenting behaviors in Singapore, comparing them with those observed in other Asian and Western societies. Dr. Cheung serves as a Research Advisor at the Singapore Children's Society and the Ministry of Family and Social Development.
