Program overview

The workshop will run for nine days, with presentations by nursing academics and researchers most days, as well as small group work and sessions with students in the INU Global Citizenship and Peace programs. Students will be assigned to groups, each group will explore and understanding the Impact of Global Conflicts on Healthcare. These workshop scenarios have been designed to allow undergraduate nursing students to identify strategies to deal with health impacts and consequences that result in global conflicts. The scenarios aim to encourage students to think about how they might advocate people who are affected in this situation with a focus on professional roles as a global citizens to promote peace and justice in the face of global conflicts. Additionally, each day will have a cultural immersive activity.

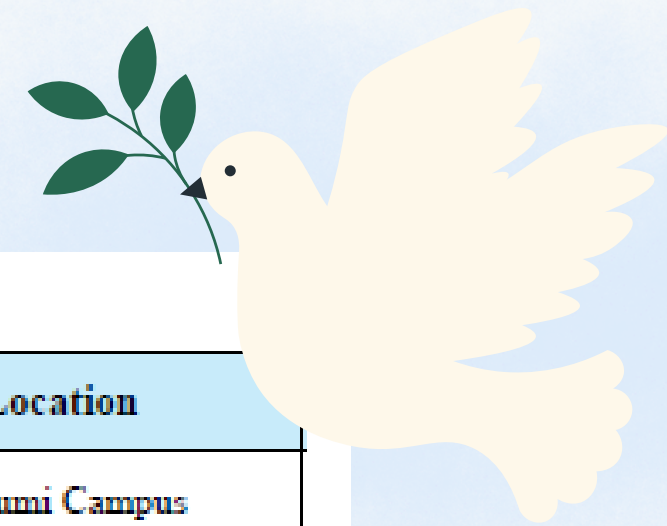
