Overview of the Dispatch Program

- Dispatch Destination : International Institute for the Unification of Private Law (UNIDROIT)
 - An independent intergovernmental organization aiming to modernize private law and establish unified principles and rules. It was established in 1926 as an auxiliary organ of the League of Nations and was reorganized in 1940 through a multilateral agreement. It has 65 member states.
- Location: Rome, Italy
- Duration of Stay: February 3 – March 7, 2025

- Participation in various symposiums and seminars hosted by international organizations
 - Collecting of information on systems for inviting overseas researchers, international education programs, and internship operations
 - Writing of academic papers in English utilizing a wealth of foreign-language resources and the latest literatures
 - Building an international network through exchanges of views with visiting researchers from around the world, aimed at future joint research
 - Development from a short-term visit to a sustainable research collaboration

 - Consider the dispatch period (coordination with university duties is necessary).

 - Share your research outcomes through the donation of books or academic papers.
