***These guidelines are for applicants who wish to enroll at Hiroshima University as their entrance (home) university in October 2026. Please note that applicants who choose the University of Graz as their entrance (home) university cannot apply using these application guidelines.**

—What is the Joint Degree Program?—

The Joint Degree Program is an academic framework in which multiple universities collaborate to design a shared curriculum and award a single degree jointly upon completion. Hiroshima University offers a Joint Degree Program in collaboration with the University of Graz, focusing on the theme of Sustainability Studies (Sustainable Development).

Students enrolled in the two-year master's program spend one year studying at Hiroshima University and one year at the partner university (University of Graz). Upon successful completion, graduates are awarded a jointly conferred Master of Science degree.

Participants in this program benefit from advanced education that leverages the expertise of each institution while experiencing diverse cultures and academic environments. This unique structure helps students naturally develop language skills and intercultural competence, broadening their global perspective.

The degree jointly awarded with the partner university upon completion of the program is expected to be highly regarded for further studies and career opportunities both in Japan and abroad. Another key feature of this program is the opportunity to build valuable networks through interactions with international students and faculty members.

This program combines the strengths of Hiroshima University, which offers courses focused on development economics and public policy and the University of Graz, which specializes in business and management aspects of sustainable development. Through this collaboration, students develop the ability to conduct research and practical work using a social science-based approach.

Financial Support

Students enrolling at Hiroshima University as their home university are eligible for the following financial support:

- **Application Fee:** Waived (Applicants to these programs are exempted from the ¥30,000 application fee.)
- **Admission Fee:** Waived (Admitted students are exempt from the ¥282,000 admission fee.)
- **Tuition Fee:** Students with outstanding academic performance may receive a full tuition waiver (annual tuition: ¥535,800, up to 2 years): *See Note1.*
- **Scholarship:** Students admitted to the program will receive the *Hiroshima University International Joint Degree Program Scholarship* (Endowed Scholarship) of **¥200,000 per semester**.

Note1: Criteria for Tuition Waiver Based on Academic Performance

First Year: Applicants who are recognized as academically outstanding based on

- (1) the transcript submitted at the time of application (with a GPA of 2.3 or higher on a 3.0 scale (*)) and
- (2) entrance examination results.

Second Year: Students whose first-year GPA is 2.3 or higher on a 3.0 scale (*).

Note2: Although students move between Hiroshima University and University of Graz on a semester basis, those admitted through this entrance examination are not required to pay admission or tuition fees to University of Graz.

The program starts in **October**, and students spend one year at Hiroshima University and one year at University of Graz during the two-year curriculum.

Applicants must submit scores from the IELTS, TOEFL, Cambridge EFL or TOEIC® and meet the English proficiency requirements defined below(※), if their native language is not English and if they do not have a bachelor's or master's degree from a program that is taught in English.

I. Admissions Policy

Admission Policy of Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences

The Master's Course of the Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences is seeking students who have a strong motivation and passion to pursue the following objectives and who have the fundamental academic abilities required to achieve them.

1. A person who is motivated to acquire, in addition to a wide range of general knowledge, a high level of knowledge and research skills in the humanities, social sciences, educational sciences and other related fields, and who eventually aims to contribute to creating a "peace science that can lead to sustainable development" from diversified perspectives
2. A person who is motivated to acquire, in addition to a wide range of general knowledge, a high level of knowledge and research skills in the humanities, social sciences, educational sciences and other related fields, and who has a willingness to address challenges currently, or potentially in the future, confronting human society in order to contribute to building a global society of diversity, freedom and peace

In order to admit such individuals, the Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences selects applicants through a multifaceted and comprehensive evaluation process based on its own Diploma Policy and Curriculum Policy, using interviews, academic tests, and external examinations.

Admission Policy of Joint International Master's Programme

In order to resolve the pressing regional and global issues related to the SDGs, especially the issues of poverty reduction, the Joint International Master's Programme in Sustainable Development (Hiroshima University - University of Graz) is designed for fostering human resources with an ability to conduct research and engage in practice based on the fundamental principles of international cooperation in development studies and through social science approaches, and those who have excellent collaboration and communication skills and exhibit competitive capability for employment in the international labor market of universities and research institutions, governmental and international organizations, the private sector, and NGO, etc.

For fostering the above human resources, our program is seeking applicants who possess the following aspirations and motivations and essential academic abilities.

1. Persons who have a certain level of English proficiency and are interested in sustainable development issues, especially global sustainability issues.
2. Persons who are motivated to analyze and evaluate complex processes from an interdisciplinary viewpoint based on the fundamental principles of international cooperation in development studies.

In order to admit such individuals, Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences selects applicants through a multifaceted and comprehensive evaluation process based on its own Diploma Policy and Curriculum Policy, using oral examination, the submitted documents, and external examinations.

III. Admission Requirements

- ◇ The applicant must meet one of the following stipulations or expected to acquire one of the following stipulations by September 30, 2026.
 - ◇ The applicant falls under stipulation 9 or 10 must refer to "Preliminary Evaluation of Admission Requirements" and undergo a preliminary evaluation of admission requirements.
1. A person who graduated from a Japanese university stipulated by the 1947 School Education Law (No. 26, Article 83)
 2. A person who has received a bachelor's degree from the National Institution for Academic Degrees and Quality Enhancement of Higher Education, in accordance with the 1947 School Education Law (No. 26, Article 104, Section 7)
 3. A person who has completed 16 years of formal schooling in a foreign country
 4. A person who has completed 16 years of formal schooling in a foreign country, by earning the credit(s) of correspondence course(s) in the schooling program in Japan
 5. A person who has taken courses from a foreign university in Japan (completing sixteen years of education) thereby completing the required number of years of schooling, of which is recognized by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (hereinafter referred to as "MEXT")
 6. A person who has been conferred a degree equivalent to a bachelor's degree through attending an overseas university or other overseas school (limited to those whose education and research activities have been evaluated by persons who have been certified by the relevant country's government or a related institution, or have been separately designated by the Minister of MEXT as being equivalent to such) and graduated from a program that requires 3 or more years to complete (Includes graduating from a program implemented by the relevant overseas school while living in Japan through distance learning, as well as graduating from a program implemented by an educational facility established with the relevant overseas country's school education system and has received the designation mentioned above)
 7. A person who has completed the specialized curriculum of a higher vocational school, of four years or more, and has been specially selected by the Minister of MEXT

 9. A person who has entered a graduate school, in accordance with the 1947 School Education Law (No. 26, Article 102, Section 2) and recognized by Graduate School as having a suitable academic ability to engage in graduate level studies
 10. A person who is 22 years old or more, recognized by Graduate School as having academic ability equivalent to that of a university graduate

Preliminary Evaluation of Admission Requirements

Applicants who fall under the stipulation 9 or 10 are required to undergo a preliminary evaluation of admission requirements. The procedures are outlined below.

For those who need to undergo a preliminary evaluation, please obtain the prescribed forms from Support Office for the fields of International Development and Cooperation by E-mail.

1. Submission period

December 11 to 17:00, December 17, 2025 (Japan Standard Time, Must Arrive)

2. Documents to be submitted

- ◇ Each certificate must be an original. However, if a new certificate is not issued, a certified copy of the original, certified by the official organization, preferably the issuing organization, will be accepted.
- ◇ Any forgery or falsification of the documents and/ or academic fraud would result in cancellation of acceptance even after passing the examination and completing enrollment procedure.

Note4: Submit a GRE General Test Official Score, if available. (The submission of the GRE score is optional.) The Official Score Report must be sent by ETS directly to Hiroshima University (Institution Code: 2358) no later than the submission period. (The Examinee Score Report sent to applicants from ETS is acceptable as well.)

2. Application Method

Applicants should obtain prior consent from their desired supervisor and submit all application documents together during the application period listed below.

(1) Application time period: **January 9 to January 22 17:00, 2026 (Japan Standard Time, Must Arrive)**

(3) Other Matters

- i) Documents may neither be altered nor amended after submission.
- ii) Application materials will not be returned in principle.
- iii) Personal information (name, date of birth, gender, etc) recorded on application forms will be used in the selection of entrants, notification of passing of entrance examinations, and also entrance procedures. Once successful applicants have entered the university, the university will manage the data for use in matters relating to student support (scholarship applications, tuition fee exemption applications etc). This data will not be used for any other purpose or be seen by anyone except staff of this university.
However, after an agreement has been made regarding the appropriate use of personal information, there may be cases whereby related business is entrusted to companies outside the university for the purposes of computer management.

V. Application for persons who require special arrangements

It is the responsibility of any applicant with a disability or for any other reason who requires special arrangements to submit an application form (no prescribed form) as follows:

1. Application period: December 11 to 17:00, December 17, 2025

Early application is advised since in some cases it will be necessary to consider how the Graduate School (Support Office for the fields of International Development and Cooperation) can meet your needs.

2. Contents of the application form

- (3) Description of the disability and/or symptoms (if under treatment, attach a medical certificate)
- (4) Special Arrangements the applicant desires in the entrance examination

- (7) Conditions of everyday life

VI. Admission

1. Selection Process

The academic examination consists of the Document Review (Academic Transcripts, Research Proposal, and other application documents) and the Oral Examination to evaluate the applicant's motivation for research, knowledge and applied skills in the applicant's field of specialization, English language skills, problem-solving ability, and aptitude.

2. Date of entrance examination

Oral Examination:

Between February 4 and February 18, 2026

※ The Oral Examination will be conducted by online. The specific date, time, and connection method will be informed by the prospective applicant's academic advisor or the Support Office after the application has been accepted.

3. Evaluation Criteria

- (1) The Documents Review and Oral Examination will be graded on a three-level scale, with Grade C considered a fail.

A	Excellent (Most Appropriate for Enrollment)
B	Good (Appropriate for Enrollment)
C	Poor (Inappropriate for Enrollment)

- (2) Those who have passed both the Document Review and Oral Examination will be successful applicants.

4. Announcement of Admission

Announcement of admission will be on **March 3, 2026 (scheduled)**.

A written notice will be sent to the successful applicants by mail. Telephone/E-mail inquiries will not be answered.

VII. Enrollment Procedure

1. Enrollment Procedure

The period will be in the beginning of March. Details will be provided separately.

2. Fees

Admission Fee: Waived (Admitted students are exempted from the ¥282,000 admission fee)

Tuition Fee: Students enrolled in Hiroshima University as their entrance(home) university and whose evaluation results and grades are judged excellent will be exempted from tuition fee ¥535,800 per year(※).

Scholarship: Students enrolled in Hiroshima University as their entrance(home) university will receive ¥200,000 financial support per semester as the Joint Degree Program Scholarship by Hiroshima University.

※Note1: Criteria for Tuition Waiver Based on Academic Performance

First Year: Applicants who are recognized as academically outstanding based on

- (1) the transcript submitted at the time of application (with a GPA of 2.3 or higher on a 3.0 scale (*)) and

- (2) For applicants accepted on the condition of graduation from currently enrolled university, admission will be cancelled if s/he cannot graduate by the time of enrollment.

- (2) Bring or send the following documents to Support Office for the fields of International Development and Cooperation.
 - i) Application Form for Disclosure of Entrance Examination Information for the Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences, Hiroshima University.
 - ii) A copy of identification document such as driver’s license.
 - iii) A self-addressed stamped envelope (standard size: 120mm×235mm, with postage for simplified registered mail up to 50 grams).

Please note that applicant may be asked for corrections if any of these are incomplete.

- (3) The Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences, Hiroshima University sends the “Notice of Determination for Disclosure of Entrance Examination Information for the Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences, Hiroshima University” to the applicant by registered mail within 30 days after the acceptance of the application.
