Hiroshima University Graduate School is accepting applications for October 2014 enrollment in the Phoenix Leader Education Program (Hiroshima Initiative) for Renaissance from Radiation Disaster (Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology - MEXT "PhD Leading Programs" accepted from FY2011).

This program aims to nurture comprehensive interdisciplinary global leaders with a basic knowledge of medicine, environmental studies, engineering, science, sociology, education and psychology capable of laterally and comprehensively managing radiation disaster recovery. The program seeks students who:

- 1. desire to contribute to the development of society with interdisciplinary knowledge and skills,
- 2. understand the suffering of others and have a strong desire to contribute to radiation disaster recovery,
- 3. desire to become leaders that play an active role in regional and global society, and;
- 4. have exceptional enthusiasm, determination, responsibility, and people skills.

This program offers specialized, integrated studies through 3 courses: "Radiation Disaster Medicine," "Radioactivity Environmental Protection," and "Radioactivity Social Recovery."
