Kenzo Oshima, the Special-Missioned Scholar of Hiroshima University's President, will provide another seminar to produce global-minded students in September. Mr. Oshima is a former Japanese ambassador to Australia, Japan's representative to the UN, and the vice-chairman of JICA.

Themes: **The Olympics, sports, and peace (Sep. 28th)**
