## 1. About the G.ecbo Program

Gecbo Program is a special graduate education program conducted with a central focus on overseas internship aiming to foster practical-minded researchers and academic-minded specialists who are actively involved in the global community. #### 2. Classes and credits to be obtained

This program, from a long-term standpoint, consists of preparatory training, overseas internship and follow-on research ("sandwich-type" education), making the internship more fruitful. The participants of this program are required to take at least the core subjects shown in the following table and the special subjects contribute to the on-site activity. However, as the handling of special subjects and class details differ depending on the graduate school, please contact the G.ecbo office in advance.

## 5. Selection

Schedule: Closing date for application: Monday October 23, 2012 12:00nn

•Documents to be submitted:

- -Application form for the G.ecbo overseas internship program (Form 1)
- \*For the domestic internship, please use its application form.
- -Purpose of application (No format; 1 or 2 A4 sheets) (Form 2)
- -Copy of certificate of English proficiency examination (TOEIC, TOEFL, etc.)
- -Approval by the academic advisor (Form 3)
- Proof of Payment for "Third Party Liability Insurance Incident to Disaster and Accident Insurance for Student Education and Research" (Bank receipt)

Interview: From Friday October 26 or Monday October 29, 2012 (tentative)

(English, in principle)

•Notification of result: Monday November 5 or Tuesday November 6, 2012

Internship Guidance: Mid November, 2012 (tentative)

《NOTE》 Selection by the program merely means acquisition of recommendation by the University. The final decision will be made by the host institution after considering the match between students' interests and the institution's capacity. Additionally, the program executive committee may conclude to turn down the dispatch of interns under certain circumstances, such as the occurrence of a serious threat to security in your host country, or if the development of candidate is assessed to be insufficient after pre-internship training.

## 6. Expenses

In principle, selected students who fully participate in the program and are dispatched overseas are given travel expenses to the airport which is closest to the host institution and partial accommodation expenses by G.ecbo. Other costs, such as visa acquisition fees or insurance and living expenses at the internship site, are the participants' responsibility, unless otherwise offered by the host institution.

#### 7. Purchase of Insurances

All students who participate in the G.ecbo program are required to purchase "Third Party Liability Insurance Incident to Disaster and Accident Insurance for Student Education and Research". In addition, in cases of overseas internship, purchasing overseas travel insurance is also required before dispatch to the internship.

#### 8. Others

• For students of the Graduate School for International Development and Cooperation, the courses to be taken when participating in this program/i-ECBO program are determined. The list of such subjects can be obtained from the contact address below.

 In some cases, a G.ecbo candidate may be recommended to apply for other program/s in parallel after the selection. In such cases, the candidates may need to prepare another application form.
